# **Overview**

As we embarked on the development of our first Open Space and Recreation Strategy for the MidCoast region we went out to our community to find out what was important to them, what they wanted improved and what we need to plan and prepare for to deliver open space in the future.

We've heard from many people across our local government area, and this section provides an overview of what we did, what we heard, and what we learned.

### **Engagement context**

Quality open space is important to everyone. It includes our parks, gardens and sports fields, footpaths and town squares, cycleways and bike paths, foreshore areas and children's playgrounds. These are spaces that are often at the heart of our communities.

Our open spaces make our cities, towns and villages more welcoming and accessible for both locals and visitors. They delight and connect people. They support our human and environmental health and wellbeing and help to build and sustain thriving local economies. They're at the heart of everyday life.

We know that having access to open space makes us healthier and happier. We also know that our parks and other green spaces are vital to maintaining physical and mental health.

The MidCoast Open Space and Recreation Strategy is a 13-year plan that provides a framework for the planning, funding and delivery of open space for the MidCoast local government area. The strategy is the first such plan for the entire local government area, and has been developed with input from locals, visitors, industry and business, recreation planners, Council staff and others.

### Goals of the engagement

The goals were to:

- inform the community about the current state of our open space
- get input on open space needs and priorities through the interactive map, online survey, poll and post-it wall, pop-ups and workshops
- gather ideas for the future planning and delivery of open space in the MidCoast
- provide an opportunity to reimagine our open spaces
- raise awareness of the value and benefits of open space that is both safe and attractive to be in and around
- provide information for the public to explore, learn about and share knowledge and experience about our open space.

# **About the Open Space and Recreation Strategy**

Between June and November 2022, we asked our community about how it currently uses open space and how its members want to use open space in the future. We also asked about what improvements could be made, whether we need more or less of what's there currently, and what if anything should stay the same. The input we received has been used to help us prepare a draft Open Space and Recreation Strategy.

The draft strategy will be placed on public exhibition to allow the community to provide feedback that will inform the final Open Space and Recreation Strategy. Once adopted by Council, this plan will guide our activities for the next 13 years, to 2036, as we plan, seek funding for and deliver open space across the MidCoast.

# What we heard

The following is a summary of the input we received from the community between June and November 2022 for input into the draft Open Space and Recreation Strategy.

We sought input from anyone with an interest in our outdoor spaces. This is a summary of how we got the word out and how people got involved.

In preparing this engagement report, we have also taken into account feedback that we've received while engaging on other strategies and plans, including our Disability Inclusion Action Plan, Aboriginal Action Plan, Child Safe Action Plan and Hallidays Point Place Strategy, and while meeting with people at our local Community Conversations sessions held between September and November 2022.

The feedback from this engagement was used to prepare the draft Open Space and Recreation Strategy. The strategy will be placed on exhibition, allowing for comment from the community. Feedback on the draft will inform the final Open Space and Recreation Strategy, which will be presented to Council for endorsement in mid-2023.

# Key insights

We gathered six key insights into what our community wants in relation to open space:

#### Key insight #1:

#### Maintenance of open space needs to be improved

People were concerned that our open space areas are often left in poor condition and then become either unusable or unsafe, and in some cases, unattractive to visitors and locals alike. It was acknowledged that maintenance can be affected by weather (unusually wet conditions in early 2021 and 2022 were noted as examples of times when mowing and other maintenance had been made difficult), however many examples given reflected a lack of funding or a regular maintenance program as being the main contributing factor.

For users, the lack of maintenance had meant they were unable to use open space facilities as they were too wet, or too dark, or too uneven, to use safely. Suggestions for improving this included designing fit for purpose facilities, having a regular maintenance program that was properly funded, and working more closely with community groups, volunteers and other land managers to share the burden.

#### Key insight #2:

#### Our existing open spaces need to be made more accessible and better connected

Many participants mentioned the need to better connect our open spaces within and between towns and villages, as well as the need to have them be more accessible particularly for people of varying physical ability. This insight was linked to Insight #1, as the lack of maintenance was sometimes mentioned as a contributing factor in poor accessibility.

The benefits of being better-connected are many. They include making it more pleasant and efficient to move around our towns and villages, encouraging more use of our open spaces, and attracting more visitors and tourists to our localities.

#### Key insight #3:

#### Open space needs could be better provided for by making spaces more flexible

We received a number of ideas and suggestions for how to make our open spaces more flexible, and how to get more out of our existing spaces without necessarily needing to increase the total number or area. Building multi-use facilities that could be shared by sporting and other groups was one example of how this could be achieved, as well as providing synthetic surfaces and better lighting.

We also received ideas for enabling multiple uses of the same space, for example by introducing equipment that is multi-use and offering activities to attract people of all ages and ability.

#### Key insight #4:

#### Cycling and walking are very important to our community

Along with maintenance, this was the most frequent area of comment across all our engagement. Our community likes to walk, a lot, and cycle too. Our local towns and villages are well-suited to walking and cycling as a means of transport, and people also expressed an interest in having more cycleways and walking trails outside our urban areas for recreational use. In many cases though, people felt our footpaths and walking tracks were not up to scratch, with many finding it difficult to navigate uneven surfaces, or expressing a desire for better facilities to make the walk a more pleasant experience.

We also heard that our walking and cycling tracks could be better sign-posted and be improved with interpretive signage to improve the experience for visitors and tourists.

#### Key insight #5:

Partnerships between open space owners, the community and volunteers need to be encouraged

We heard from many people that we are missing opportunities to have better quality and maintained open space by not having more partnerships with organisations, community groups and volunteers. These partnerships do exist, both formally and informally, and we heard many examples of where they have worked well.

Some practical suggestions were also made for improving how we currently work with volunteers and community organisations, and those included providing training and equipment for volunteers to use when maintaining open space. While we do often work with organisations such as National Parks and State Forest, there is more we can do.

#### Key insight #6:

#### Our open space needs to be conserved and protected for future generations

When we asked people about the legacy they want to leave future generations, they were very clear about one thing: they want us to make sure we protect and conserve our existing open space for future generations to enjoy. There was a sense from some respondents that we may be losing some of our open space to big developments, although some also noted that development often provides an opportunity to have our open space improved and new facilities provided.

Either way, the community was clear about wanting to see our open space areas conserved and not left to deteriorate, and that to do this, we would need to make sure we provide both resources and funding for the short, medium and long term.

# **Improvements needed**

We had many requests for improvements to specific open space locations and facilities, many of which we have included in our Draft Open Space and Recreation Strategy. These are the types of improvements we heard about most frequently:

- provide more cycleways and footpaths, and make them safer
- make more places for young children to play
- provide challenging open space activities that encourage adventure
- provide more shade, seating and toilets in existing open spaces
- make better use of our existing open spaces, by making them more accessible, and making them multi-use
- provide better access to our foreshore areas
- enhance and protect our beautiful natural environment.

Participants also asked us to consider the following ideas.

- Off-road cycling tracks
- Viewing platforms in foreshore areas
- More challenging skateparks
- Painting handrails and installing art to freshen up our parks
- A frisbee golf course and a Ninja course
- Using fire trails as shared walking and cycling paths
- Lighting and better drainage to allow sports fields to be used at night
- Native gardens and wildflower trails
- Splash zone for children
- Installing outdoor gym equipment for everyone to use
- Solar powered fairy lights and more power outlets installed at BBQ areas

### What we did

From 24 June to 30 November 2022, we asked the community about how they use their open space, what currently works well and what changes they would like to see. For our non-face to face engagement, we used a combination of surveys (phone and online), an online interactive map, quick poll, and a post-it wall to find out how people currently use open space in the MidCoast local government area. We also asked for suggestions for what people would like more of, less of and kept the same, and what to improve in our open space.

A wide cross-section of our community got involved, including:

- under 18-years, 75+ years, and everyone in between
- sporting clubs, community groups, environment groups
- people with a disability
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islanders
- business owners
- volunteers
- visitors to the MidCoast,

We used a variety of channels to let people know that we wanted their input, including website, Facebook, Instagram, email, flyers, newspaper advertising, editorial in newspapers, media releases, newsletters, posters in shop windows, and presentations and other meetings with Council staff. We also made the information widely available for our staff so they could participate and share with friends and family. Refer to the appendices to this report for copies of the collateral.

The engagement was undertaken in three stages. First, using a statistically valid phone survey of 200 residents, we sought feedback from the community on their values and behaviours in relation to open space and recreation. Then we visited local markets, shopping centres and sports fields and spoke to people, and distributed information at Community Conversations and through the media, via email and on our website, inviting people to complete our online survey, add their comments and ideas on our interactive map and post-it wall, and answer the poll questions. We then explored the input we had received during these first two stages further in eight workshops that anyone could attend.

During the engagement with the community, we shared analysis of the current state of our open space, presented in the report *Draft Open Space and Recreation Needs Analysis*.

On the following pages are descriptions of the main engagement activities, and data on how many and what people responded to each.

# How we got the word out

#### Website

We published the "Re-thinking our outdoor spaces" web page on 23 June 2022 to let the community know about the project. The website included information about the current status of our open space, and the steps to develop an Open Space and Recreation Needs Strategy for the LGA.

It also featured an interactive map of the LGA, for users to add ideas and comments, and our open space survey. During the engagement period, the website received 6,208 visitor views, with just over 40% of visits lasting over one minute.

#### Social media

From 24 June to 30 November 2022, seven posts were published on our Facebook page, to let people know about the engagement. The posts promoted the interactive map, online survey, pop-up stalls, and workshops. The posts were seen by 2,357 people.

#### Media releases, newspaper and TV coverage and radio

The Open Space and Recreation Strategy engagement was announced in a media release ('Re-thinking our outdoor spaces') on 24 June 2022 and distributed to local and regional media. On 20 October 2022, we issued a media release inviting anyone to register for a workshop to discuss open space in the MidCoast.

Our staff were interviewed on local radio about the open space strategy three times during the engagement period.

#### Flyer/postcard, poster, email and enewsletter

We distributed around 1,500 flyer/postcard across the LGA at events, in shops, through our libraries and Council offices and at our Community Conversation meetings and put posters in shop windows and libraries in Gloucester, Nabiac, Forster, Wingham, Taree and Tea Gardens. Refer to Appendix A for copies of the flyer and poster.

We also sent around 3,400 emails to our community database membership and included 22 articles about the engagement in 17 editions of our weekly newsletter, News Wrap.

## **Online engagement**

Community members provided input on their views on open space online via an interactive map and survey, two polls and an 'post-it wall'.

#### Interactive map

We invited people to submit ideas on an interactive map. We had 516 comments on the map, and these added to a bank of ideas gathered throughout the other engagement activities. See Appendix F for the final interactive map with comments.

The interactive map was available from 24 June to 30 November 2022. We invited the community to post about their favourite open space, or identify places that needed improvement, or suggest a project they would like to see delivered in the future. The map was viewed 13,244 times, by 216 users who posted 516 comments.

#### Phone survey

In late June 2022, Micromex Research, a research company contracted by us to gather statistically relevant data, contacted 200 MidCoast residents by landline and mobile on our behalf, and asked them to tell us:

- 1. What their priorities are for open space.
- 2. How they currently use open space.
- 3. What their preferred recreation activities are, and what else they would like to do.

The sample was weighted by age, location and gender to reflect the 2021 ABS community profile of MidCoast Council.

Of the 200 people we surveyed:

- 8% identify as Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander
- 23% identify as having a disability, or caring for someone with a disability
- 42% are a member of a sports club or association
- 9% are single with no children
- 11% are single with children living at home
- 2% live in a group or shared home
- 52% are female, 48% are male
- 61% live in the northern coastal or central part of the LGA
- 29% live in the southern coastal area
- 10% live in the western part of the LGA
- 18% are aged between 16 and 34 years
- 17% are aged between 35 and 49 years
- 26% are aged between 50 and 64 years
- 39% are aged over 65 years

The findings from the phone survey are reported in detail further in the document. The summary report from Micromex can be found in Appendix B.

#### **Open Space Survey**

The 'Open Space Survey' was open from 24 June to 30 November 2022. The purpose of the survey was to gain insight into the current use of open space by people in the MidCoast region, and of their open space needs and priorities over the next thirteen years.

The survey was based on the phone survey that was conducted on our behalf by Micromex Research.

The survey was on the webpage from 24 June to 30 November 2022 and had 447 responses. We asked about people's use of and attitudes towards open space in the MidCoast LGA and outside it, and included questions about activities, frequency of use, priorities for improvements and investment. The questions were a mix of multiple choice and free text. Results from the online survey are shown on following pages, with the survey questions in Appendix C.

#### Post-it wall and quick poll

The post-it wall was available online between June and November, and we asked people to tell us their dream idea for outdoor spaces in the MidCoast. 187 people made contributions to the post-it wall. See Appendix D for the results.

The quick poll was also open for people to contribute to between June and November 2022, and we asked people to respond to three statements:

- 1. One thing I love about open spaces in the MidCoast:
- 2. One thing we need more of in the future
- 3. One thing about outdoor spaces that could be improved

125 people completed the quick poll. See Appendix E for the full results.

### Face-to-face engagement

For our face-to-face engagement, we met people at "pop-ups" at local markets, shopping centres and sportsgrounds, and in workshops across the LGA. We also presented at meetings of our local chambers of commerce, and we spoke to representatives from major sporting bodies.

# What you told us

This section provides detail about what people told us through the various engagement activities. From June to November 2022, we asked locals and visitors to tell us about open space in the MidCoast. We did this through a variety of communication channels including our website and social media, local newspapers and radio stations. We sought input from people via pop-up stalls, surveys, online interactive map, polls and workshops.

#### Phone survey

The following table provides a summary of the responses provided by the 200 phone survey participants. Participants were selected at random, by calling a fixed landline or a mobile number, and represented each demographic group in the MidCoast LGA, based on the 2021 ABS data provided in the MidCoast community profile (see <u>Home | MidCoast Council |</u> <u>Community profile</u>).


#### Question 1: One thing I love about outdoor spaces in the MidCoast

They are normally tidy and clean.




#### Question 2: One thing we will need more of in the future


Quotes from respondents to our online poll:

#### Survey responses

Our open space survey ran from 24 June to 30 November 2022, and we received 447 responses.


We asked respondents about their current use of open space, what improvements and investment they wanted to see, what the barriers were to their participation in open space activities, and what their future needs were.

Following is a summary of what they said.

#### Outdoor activities

We asked people what activities they do in the MidCoast region in a normal year.

The most popular activities were walking, picnics and BBQs, relaxing / sitting / meditating and bushwalking.



#### Improvements

We asked people if they could only make one improvement, what it would be. Many people spoke about improving connections between open spaces and towns and villages. Others wanted improved or upgraded facilities and amenities such as toilets and BBQ / picnic areas. Maintenance was high on many people's lists, as was shade in parks and along footpaths.

Here are some of the responses people made:




#### Reasons for spending time outdoors


#### Priorities

#### Neighbourhood / regional focus


We asked whether people wanted resources focused on neighbourhood open spaces or regional open spaces, or split across both.

Some of the other activities included dog agility, swimming and surfing, kayaking, 4x4 driving on beaches, camping, rock climbing and activities for children.




#### Barriers to participation

We asked people what the barriers were to participation in open space activities.

The main barriers that people reported were no facilities close by, don't know what is available, not enough time and lack of information.

People also mentioned lack of shade, poor surfaces, inadequate facilities for children and lack of an outdoor pool close by as barriers.



Workshop question four: When it comes to open space, I've always wondered why...

We asked the workshop participants to complete the above sentence and let us know what they're perplexed about when it comes to open space in the MidCoast. The main areas they mentioned were:

Connections: why our open spaces aren't better-connected.

Maintenance: why there isn't more of it, and why it takes a long time for Council to fix things.

**Utilisation and care:** why it's not better-utilised, and why some people don't take better care of it.

Quality: why some areas in the MidCoast seem to be better maintained than others.

**Planning:** why we don't have a long-term plan for its development and upkeep.

Some quotes from the workshops:

Our area seems to be left behind; not enough improvements

Car parks at Harrington breakwall and Crowdy Head are in bad condition

We build poor quality construction (although lately this has changed), assets are in poor condition and were poorly planned and undersized, not fit for purpose

Why we can't maintain tracks ourselves and have bins available for rubbish disposal.

Spaces aren't connected.

We don't have continuity of access along the foreshore

## Children's feedback

We also heard from children through conversations with them at pop-up stalls and in the workshops, where we ran specific activities to engage with them and hear their ideas. A colouring in competition also encouraged kids to talk about their ideas for great open space.

#### Pop-ups

Children visited the pop-ups held in July across the MidCoast. They were encouraged to provide their feedback via one of the online tools available.

#### Workshops

The eight workshops held in November 2022 included activities and a colour-in competition for children aged two to twelve. Around 13 children and adolescents attended the Gloucester (six), Taree (one), Tea Gardens (one) and Pacific Palms (five) consultations. Pre-teens and adolescents joined the adults and participated in the workshop activities.

Feedback was collected from children about their experiences of MidCoast open space in Gloucester, Taree, Pacific Palms and Tea Gardens. Children were asked about the outdoor spaces they enjoy and were invited to contribute to a large visual map to highlight their favourite outdoor activities and places.




#### Results

Children, even at very young ages, are seeking more adventurous outdoor play and exploration options. More ambitious playground equipment (such as bigger slides, and Ninja playgrounds) were suggestions at several places including Gloucester and Wingham. Tree climbing and climbing rock walls, obstacle courses and even an improved park run were all put forward by MidCoast children. Children also expressed their preference for interaction with nature, including ideas like a bird sanctuary.





























# Appendix A: Detailed Background & Methodology





## Background & Methodology

Sample selection and error

A total of 200 resident interviews were completed. Respondents were selected by means of a computer based random selection process using Sample Pages and Australian Marketing Lists.

A sample size of 200 residents provides a maximum sampling error of plus or minus 6.9% at 95% confidence. This means that if the survey was replicated with a new universe of N=200 residents, 19 times out of 20 we would expect to see the same results, i.e. +/- 6.9%.

For the survey under discussion the greatest margin of error is 6.9%. This means, for example, that an answer such as 'yes' (50%) to a question could vary from 45% to 45%.

The sample was weighted by age and gender to reflect the 2021 ABS Census data for MidCoast Council..

Interviewing

Interviewing was conducted in accordance with The Research Society Code of Professional Behaviour.

Prequalification

Participants in this survey were pre-qualified as being over the age of 16, and not working for, nor having an immediate family member working for MidCoast Council.

Data analysis

The data within this report was analysed using Q Professional.

Within the report, blue and red font colours are used to identify statistically significant differences between groups, i.e., gender, age, property type, etc.

Significance difference testing is a statistical test performed to evaluate the difference between two measurements. To identify the statistically significant differences between the groups of means, 'One-Way Anova tests' and 'Independent' Samples T-tests' were used. 'Z Tests' were also used to determine statistically significant differences between column percentages.

### Percentages

All percentages are calculated to the nearest whole number and therefore the total may not exactly equal 100%.
