Green waste

Diverting waste from landfill starts by knowing what can or can't go in your green garden waste bin.

Put these items in your green bin:



Garden prunings.



Grass clippings.



Leaves and bark.



Small branches and twigs.



Weeds.

Composting is good for the environment and saves you money.

Why buy fertiliser when you can make your own? Make use of your kitchen scraps and divert them from landfill. No need for harsh, chemical fertilisers.

Composting helps with water retention, saving you money on your water bill. Enjoy a healthier garden and a bounty of fresh produce.

Put these items in the kerbside bins:

- Animal droppings (put them in your red general waste bin).
- · Invasive weeds (bagged and placed in your red bin).
- Bags of any type, including plastic bags, potting mix bags, hessian or geotextile bags (put them in your red bin). Keep green waste unbagged.
- Food and kitchen scraps, including fruit and vegetables (compost these or put them in your red bin).
- General rubbish (put this in your red bin).
- Recyclables (put these in your yellow recycling bin).

Take these items to a MidCoast waste centre:

- Clumps of root material, such as cocos palms and bougainvilleas.
- Soil, potting mix, bricks or construction waste.
- Trees stumps and large limbs.
